HUSBAND - Francis (I) WEBSTER

The christening of Francis and his siblings comes from Wymondham parish registers, as does the marriage of his parents. These data were found by Amy VanCott and confirmed without problem (Film no.1911510). Francis Webster led a truly interesting, unusual, and impressive life. For an account of his time in Australia, in the California gold rush, and afoot with his family in the Martin Handcart company crossing the Rocky Mountains in the winter of 1856, CLICK on Personal Histories.
